The Haque Summer School

Do you want to make a difference to the world's big issues? The Hague Summer School in the Netherlands is a cutting-edge two or four week modular course, which looks at solving global issues by connecting the public and private sectors. We look at these 'wicked' problems through the eyes of engineers, human rights and security professionals and entrepreneurs.

t The Hague Summer School you will approach worldwide issues from different angles in a multidisciplinary setting. You will gain an unique and international experience, with fellow students and lecturers from all over the world and different areas of expertise.

You will have the opportunity to network with staff and guest lecturers from a diverse background. This will give you an optimal preparation for global employment and a head start on

The Summer School programme

The Hague Summer School is a modular course made up of general and elective modules. You can choose to study for a two week or four week period. The two-week summer course consists of a general module and an elective module of your choice. The four-week summer course consists of two general modules and two elective modules. Each elective includes at least three organisational visits.

Elective module topics include changing entrepreneurship, nudging, design for the future, governance, human security and rights and cyber security, business and peace and designing a digital nation.

The theme for 2016: Water

This year the theme for the next Summer School is 'water'.

Drinking water is becoming an increasingly scarce resource – at the same time – global warming is causing severe flooding and rises in sea levels. The intergovernmental Panel on climate change (IPCC) predicts that by the end of the 21st century in 95% of the ocean area sea levels will have risen.

We must develop strategies to keep water away from populated areas. And where better to discuss water management than the Netherlands? We are the world's best-known water managers. We have a great track record in building flood defences and reclaiming new land and have one of the best drinking water sustems in the world.

Course content

At The Hague Summer School 2016, we hope to spark discussions on 'water' between students and experts. Our two general modules span issues from global water management to change and innovation in water management.

Teaching methods

Because we are a Dutch university of applied sciences, you'll find that all our courses are hands-on. We employ a problemsolving approach, just like the real professional world.

You'll experience an enriching learning environment with exercises that nurture personal leadership skills, like games, debate and group work. Our guest lecturers come from the private and public fields in The Hague and The Netherlands.

After a successful completion you will be rewarded eight or four European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) points respectively and will receive a certificate.

MODULES

Week 1 and 2 (Monday until Friday)

General module (1 ECTS)

Do you want to be a catalyst for change? In this module you will learn all about the importance of connectivity between the public & private sectors in order to deal with world's 'Wicked Problems'.

Elective modules (3 ECTS) choose one out of 4

Cyber security and safety management

Governments, NGOs, citizens and private organisations are working together more often to enhance safety and security. You will map risks for organisations and will be challenged on how to manage these risks in a continuously changing environment.

Entrepreneurship in the next economy

Get to know your 'inner entrepreneur' and learn all about entrepreneurship in a changing world. You will learn about new types of enterprises and become familiar with innovative business models and financing to promote entrepreneurship in society.

Business and Peace

This module was designed in collaboration with UPEACE. We focus on the role of the business sector in building peace and stability through responsible and fair water management for all, thus preventing and addressing conflicts caused by water shortages.

Designing a digital country

The Netherlands is one of the country's leading the way in the development of the information society. You will explore current trends and innovations and examine the potential policies stimulating future digital developments in society.

Week 3 and 4 (Monday until Friday)

General module (1 ECTS)

Human rights, security and development

We will look at the current state of nudging, the ethical, moral and psychological implications and how we can apply it to its full potential in the public and private contexts. We'll look at nudging in product design and technological developments and as marketing technique.



Cultural and social programme

The Hague is packed with 131 international institutions, 80 justice organisations, 300 international businesses, many NGO's and the seat of the Dutch government. You will be able to visit international institutions, like the Peace Palace and the International Criminal Court, depending on the modules you choose. There will be a chance to visit cultural gems like the Mauritshuis gallery and the Escher Museum.

The Hague Summer School offers an extensive social programme during evenings and weekends. You'll make new friends from all over the world who may even end up being your future colleagues.

Many activities are organised through The Student Hotel where you will be staying, for example, beach barbecues, city bike rides, games nights, treasure hunts and, of course, a Dutch Night.

School covers your main costs, including tuition fees, accommodation, lunches and coffee breaks on class days, study materials (except books), cultural visits and social activities. The four-week course costs €2.998 and the two-week course costs €1.499. Students of our partner universities are entitled to a reduced fee.

Hague Summer School students stay at The Student Hotel, an all-inclusive student venue close to The Hague

The Student Hotel has modern, fully furnished rooms with large shared kitchens, private en-suite bathrooms, quiet study areas, lively social areas and 24-hour security.
